Mennonite Church USA

Mennonite Church USA has launched "Learn, Pray, Join: Mass Incarceration," an initiative to raise awareness about the injustices in our criminal legal system that cause pain and suffering, especially for poor people and people of color. This initiative is in response to a recently adopted MC USA study resolution titled, "For Justice in the U.S. Criminal Legal System," written by Zachariah Begly and Eli Reimer.

Research shows that the U.S. imprisons more people per capita than any other nation, at a staggering rate of 573 per 100,000 residents! Through October, MC USA will seek to engage people in the initiative by offering resources, prayers and ways to care for those harmed by our criminal legal system and to address systemic issues that lead to mass incarceration, such as racism and poverty.

Mass incarceration is easy to ignore when you believe you are not directly impacted. However, Jesus calls each of us to connect our faith with our actions, to care for those in need as we walk with God and that includes responding to the injustice within our communities. The initiative will look closely at the theology that drives our response to social justice issues and offer hope through an Anabaptist vision of restorative justice. Learn more here.
