Greetings from Filer Mennonite Church in Filer, ID. It has been some time since you have had an update from Filer. We do give praise as God has provided much for which we as a congregation are thankful. Possibly the last you recall is reading of our change from pews to chairs—yes, padded chairs which feel very good. We have praise for God who provided us with "the 5 senses" that allow us to enjoy many things during our day. The pews were re-made into cabinets in the purchased older home for a parsonage. Touch and sight have been involved. Hearing was useful as the wood was formed into boards, then installed as cabinets. Recently, on August 12th, someone entered the church to learn that "smell" can give a very bad reaction. We learned that a blocked city sewer line had back up into our church basement. As the cleanup company removed 1300 gallons of that raw sewerage, the smell lingered for days. Thankfully, the Eichelbergers opened their home for the congregation and we held services there for two Sundays. At last, on the 28th, we held worship services back in our church building, however, no one was allowed in the basement. The company still has much restoration work ahead. Seattle Mennonite Partners to Create Affordable Housing

We, at Seattle Mennonite Church, are excited to be on the verge of a dream we've been imagining for years. Because of a generous gift we received decades ago, we have been able to accumulate properties in the Lake City neighborhood of Seattle - both for our own use and with the long term intention of creating sustainable and affordable housing for the neighborhood. And it's finally happening!



After years of careful listening within the congregation, we discerned a readiness to release our property - all 1.3 acres of it - and began a serious search for a partner developer who would meet our desires to serve the neighborhood, create affordable living space, be sustainable and land-honoring and, of course, allow space for our worship and programs. Community Roots Housing became that partner. They too spent 2-3 years listening not only to us but to the neighborhood and other stakeholders, learning what is most needed in the community. A few months ago we signed a purchase and sale agreement with them and made it official.

Now we're in the exciting phase of being able to envision what this new building will be. Not only will it create space for up to 250 households, but will house neighborhood non-profits, offer for retail opportunities, community gathering space both indoors and outdoors and a new home for SMC. Community Roots and their construction and architectural partners are working hard both on design and on pulling together all the funding needed to make an enormous affordable housing development like this possible.

While it's not likely to break ground for at least a year, we at Seattle Mennonite are excited to imagine not only our new worship and meeting spaces but who our new neighbors will be and how community might be re-imagined in the years ahead.

Pacific Northwest Mennonite Historical Society



At its April board meeting, the PNMHS took action to recognize historian, writer, and the first president of the society, Hope Lind, by naming the library at the Lvan & Pearl Kropf Heritage Center in Hubbard, OR, the "Hope Lind Library." Hope was part of the formation of the Oregon Mennonite Historical and Genealogical Society in 1987 and currently resides in Pennsylvania.

In 1974, Hope became the historian of the Pacific Northwest Mennonite Conference. In that role, as she was researching a book on Mennonites in Oregon, she tested a vision for a local historical society at a meeting she called of 14 persons who met on November 7, 1987. As a result of the interest generated at that meeting, the conference approved the formation of the Oregon Mennonite Historical & Genealogical Society. OMHGS, later re-named Pacific Northwest Mennonite Historical Society, would be an inter-Mennonite organization, not affiliated formally with any Mennonite conference. Hope served as the Society's first president. Her book, *Apart and Together: Mennonites in Oregon and Neighboring States, 1876-1976*, was published by the Society in 1990.

- 3 years of work progressively responsible experience providing pastoral/spiritual care, which includes holding a leadership position with operational administrative leaders in a health care setting. (Preferred).
- Evidence of current understanding of Mennonite theology and ethics.
