From Our Executive Conference Minister, Eric Massanari

Hitting the Ground Learning

Greetings in the love and peace of Christ! I write these words on my very first day serving as the new conference minister of Pacific Northwest Mennonite Conference. This day seemed far off when it was first set on the calendar a few months ago. However, as our family leaned into the many tasks of our move from Kansas to the PNW, the days and weeks passed quickly. I've felt warmly and enthusiastically welcomed by many of you already, and I'm excited to begin this work and get to know more of the wonderful people who are part of the PNMC community!



After 23 years of living in Kansas, coming to the PNW is something of a homecoming for us. My wife, Yolanda Kauffman, was born and raised in Portland, OR and Portland was our first home after we were married. That was followed by two years at Drift Creek Camp as caretakers and hosts (1994-1996). Yolanda's family members remain in the Portland area, and during our years away in Colorado and Kansas my own immediate family members relocated to this region, too. My sister's family lives in

Bellingham, WA and my parents now reside in Lynden, WA. My sister and brother-in-law have a wonderful little apartment on their property in Bellingham and this is where we are now living while we look for a house in the area. We are particularly exploring communities in Skagit County where Yolanda has started her job as a hospice social worker with Hospice of the Northwest.

There will be much more given and received in the months ahead, but for now I want to share with you my intention to begin this work by "hitting the ground learning" rather than "hitting the ground *running*." For me it is a difference between pace and focus. Though there will, of course, be many tasks to attend to, I want to be sure that my **primary focus** during the next 6-8 months rests squarely on building healthy relationships and establishing good ground for what will hopefully be my long-term service and growth in this role.

Between now and our annual meeting in Portland next June, I will prioritize learning about the formative stories and present-day life within the PNMC community. A concerted effort will be given during these months to meetings with pastors and congregations, leadership teams, constituency groups, denominational leaders and others who are integral to the life of PNMC. I want to listen with care to how you sense the Spirit of God is at work in your life, in your ministries and in our common life as the Body of Christ.

I will be carrying into this work a verse that has held particularly deep meaning for me in my various ministry experiences and in my own spiritual journey: "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." (John 12:24). These words remind me of the transforming, enlivening power of Christ's love, and the truth that all transformation and growth inevitably bring endings as well as new beginnings. Folks at Evergreen are taking action against hunger. They share these ideas for others in the conference to take local action:

- Send letters to your congressional representatives (Contact evergreenmennonite@gmail.com for examples)
- Contribute food to local food pantry
- · Give to food insecurity focused non-profit organizations
- Set aside an amount monthly/forego indulgences and re-allocate amount to fight hunger
- Carry a sack in your car for people on street corners with non-perishable food, gloves, water, hand warmers. Consider including an encouraging note and/or scripture.
- Volunteer at a meal site
- Give some of your food to the hungry and some of your clothing to the naked.
- PRAY re: food insecurity/inequality
- Voice food insecurity/inequality concerns on social media and urge friends to contact congressional representatives
- Organize an offering of letters to congress through **BREAD FOR THE WORLD**
