Advent: Into the Wilderness



See, I am sending my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying in the wilderness . . . MARK 1:2-3

Perhaps it was only in the wilderness of the Jordan River that John the Baptist's message could be heard and understood. People had to leave behind the comforts of home, the noise of daily living and their carefully ordered lives. They needed to venture out into a place that had a reputation for being dangerous and unnerving for its utter unfamiliarity and disquieting silences. They had to accept such vulnerable exposure before they could fully turn toward what was most true and real: a life in God they had not yet known or ever expected.

Perhaps it is only in the wilderness experiences of our lives that we hear and understand some new thing, a new birth that is waiting but cannot yet be perceived. The wilderness of not knowing, not seeing, not controlling is always present, sometimes at the very margins of our living. And sometimes—in unsettling, uncertain times such as these—the wilderness might feel like it is everywhere we look. Always it invites us to traverse its reaches and prepare to turn, and turn yet again, and **discover that Christ is already there, waiting to be born anew**.

Wherever you might be asked to enter the wilderness at this moment, may you know and trust that Christ is there, a light in the darkness that shall not be overcome.

Pacific Northwest Mennonite Historical Society

Plan now to attend the Pacific Northwest Mennonite Historical Societies' annual meeting to be held on Saturday, February 11, 2023, at Zion Mennonite Church. Lunch will be served at noon with the program following at 1:30 pm.

Speakers will be Austin and Sherilyn Smucker from Madras, OR. They will share their experience of being held as hostages in Haiti from October 16 to December 15, 2021. They were two of the seventeen Christian missionaries who were kidnapped by the 400 Mawozo Gang after visiting a local orphanage in Port-au-Prince on October 16. The group, comprised of Amish, Mennonite, and other conservative Anabaptist communities, included 16 US citizens and one Canadian. Five of those kidnapped were children. More information will be available in early January.

Sarah Augustine, who is a Pueblo (Tewa) descendant, is a co- founder and executive director of the Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery Coalition. She is also the co-founder of Suriname Indigenous Health Fund (SIHF), where she has worked in relationship with vulnerable and Indigenous Peoples since 2005. She has represented the interests of Indigenous community partners to their own governments, the Inter-American Development Bank, the United Nations, the Organization of American States Inter-American Commission on Human Rights, the World Health Organization and a host of other international actors, including corporate interests. In 2011, she co-wrote the World Council of Churches' "Statement on the Doctrine of Discovery and its Enduring Impacts on Indigenous Peoples," and shared in the creation of the ecumenical Indigenous Peoples network. She is a columnist for Anabaptist World and co-hosts the Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery podcast with Sheri Hostetler. She has written for Sojourners, The Mennonite, Anabaptist Witness, Response Magazine, and other publications, as well as a variety of academic journals. She has taught at Heritage University, Central Washington University and Goshen College. In Washington State, where she lives, she serves in a leadership role on multiple boards and commissions to enable vulnerable peoples to speak for themselves in advocating for structural justice. She and her husband, Dan Peplow, and their son live in the Yakima Valley of Washington. She is author of the book "The Land Is Not Empty: Following Jesus in Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery".
