Healing and Hope

As congregations that make up the Pacific Northwest Mennonite Conference, we are attracted, pulled together, and guided by the Christ in whom we place our faith. Our shared vision is to grow as communities of grace, joy, and peace, so that God's healing and hope flow through us to the world.

Congregations are the core of our communities, and they reflect both our unity and our diversity. To nurture and support healthy congregations, we have resources at the conference (PNMC) and denominational (MC USA) level. Important denominational decisions are made by congregational representatives, or delegates, who gather from time to time.

In mid-2022, the MC USA delegate body came together in Kansas City and reconsidered the MC USA Membership Guidelines. The delegate body affirmed a resolution that rescinded those Guidelines, affirmed repentance for the damage they have caused to many people including credentialed pastors who had performed same-sex marriages, and affirmed that congregations and pastors are empowered to make decisions based on their local context. Meanwhile, PNMC had Policy 5.3.2, the "Ministerial Credential Review Process," that had been founded on the now-rescinded denominational Membership Guidelines. This policy specifically mandated that a credential review be conducted for any pastor who chose to officiate at a same-sex wedding ceremony.

The PNMC Board met on January 21, 2023, and determined that without the MC USA Guidelines in place, there is no longer a clear rationale for the associated PNMC policy. As a result, the Board rescinded PNMC Policy 5.3.2. However, the Board also strongly affirmed the opening statement of this policy: "We are a diverse conference, and we will continue to treat one another with a spirit of forbearance, grace, trust and love on this as well as other issues that divide us."

As congregations and members of PNMC, we value our unity and our diversity. We are united by the Christ in whom we place our faith and whose love connects us, one to another, and together with our world. Together, we turn towards the presence of Christ within us and among us, as we express God's enduring, transforming love in unique and varied ways.

Volunteers came from Hyde Park Mennonite Fellowship in Boise, ID and First Mennonite Church in Aberdeen. Included in the group were Project Director, Robert Unrau, as well as Michele WhiteEagle, MDS Regional Board Chair. Another ten members of Filer joined the effort.



You might remember the last time Filer shared news in the e-Bulletin? Our last post was regarding the mess we were facing caused by city sewage blockage. Soon after, the church learned that insurance covered only the clean up operations, leaving the congregation with the significant restoration costs. As we explored options, someone mentioned asking Mennonite Disaster Service to help. *HELP they did!* The restoration project grew beyond the bare minimum. The generous volunteers were able to update and improve the Fellowship Hall by adding sheetrock to the old paneling in the entire room and they were also able to update the lighting. New carpet is scheduled to be installed. Bright, newly painted white walls provide a clean fresh look and feel. The church basement is being completely transformed!

We are so grateful to the Mennonite Disaster Service volunteers! Your expertise and hard work have made all the difference. You have been able to transform a hard situation into something beautiful. *Praise God for fellow believers to encourage and help!*
