About our guest presenter: Malinda Elizabeth Berry is a member of the teaching faculty at AMBS, where she focuses her work on peace theology, More-with-Less ethics, and shalom hermeneutics. She was introduced to nonviolent communication (NVC) through psychotherapy and found it illuminating for her experience of being an Anabaptist-Mennonite Christian. She has studied NVC with three different teachers and weaves their varying approaches to NVC for Mennonites who are looking for:

- spiritual practices that will increase peace in their lives
- ways to make their commitments to peace and justice more relationally resonant
- new ways to talk about worn-out topics with family members, coworkers, or church members
- approaches to reading and study that bring the Bible alive with wisdom, not just words

"Naturally, it's meaningful for me to share ideas I'm passionate about with others, especially in denominational settings. But these are never one-way interactions — sitting in a virtual circle with folks who are in the front rows of church life in the stunning vastness of the PNW's hamlets, urban centers, and everything in between gave me the chance to listen and learn in a space where I was also tasked with talking and teaching. It's exciting to think about how nonviolent communication can enhance the work you all are doing: praying for clarity, celebrating growth and change, discerning next steps, grieving losses, resting and healing, and being church together.

In the weeks since the CCC as I reflect on that

gathering, I have been reminded that one of the gifts of Anabaptist theology and spirituality in our time is our basic belief that through Jesus, God is making shalom (salvation, justice, & peace). When we join Jesus' mission to "catch and release people for the Kingdom," we affirm that no act of compassion and kindness is too small for God to notice and multiply (mustard seeds, yeast, sheep, coins...). So the next time you or I face something difficult, let's agree to open the gift of self-compassion. I can say from my own experience that God knows your size and color preferences, and it'll arrive faster than Amazon Prime." -Malinda Berry

Experienced bikers will help individuals or groups map out routes of various levels. Whether participants are leisurely bike riders or more competitive, there will be several route options available! At 2500' elevation and plenty of hills to climb, Camp CAMREC is a great base camp to kick bike fitness into high gear in preparation for any planned summer rides/tours. Students can complete the 21-credit-hour certificate part time in two years, either fully online or with a combination of distance-friendly and campus-based courses.
