Introducing New PNMC District Pastors

More than thirteen years ago, Pacific Northwest Mennonite Conference (PNMC) established a leadership model that included several District Pastors appointed to serve on a voluntary basis and to assist the Executive Conference Minister in supporting congregations and ministry leaders throughout the broad geographic area of PNMC. Through subsequent years, an effort has been made to ensure that each PNMC congregation is assigned a District Pastor who, ideally, lives in proximity to the congregation and is available for regular support, consultation and visitation. The District Pastors have been a vital link in nurturing healthy congregations and our vibrant conference community.

This past year brought the retirement of two of our District Pastors, Merritt Welty (serving churches in Idaho, including Evergreen Heights Mennonite Church, Meridian Mennonite Church, Filer Mennonite Church and First Mennonite in Aberdeen) and Bob Buxman (serving Ministerios Restauración in Portland, OR). We are grateful for their years of service on behalf of these congregations and pastors, and the conference as a whole.

One of my goals for this first year serving as the PNMC Executive Conference Minister has been to ensure that each of our pastors and congregations is connected with a District Pastor. Additionally, I have sought to establish a District Pastor for Chaplains, as a way of supporting the active chaplains who are credentialed by our conference and serving in our communities.

I am excited to share with you that we have recently appointed two new PNMC District Pastors to fulfill these roles. Jack Swaim, from Boise, ID, will be serving as the District Pastor for Evergreen Heights Mennonite Church (ID), Meridian Mennonite Church (ID), First Mennonite Church in Aberdeen (ID), and Shalom Church (Spokane, WA). Charlene Epp, from Anacortes, WA, will be serving as our new District Pastor for Chaplains, supporting those persons serving in chaplaincy positions across the conference. We offer Jack and Charlene a warm welcome to these roles and our gratitude for nurturing healthy leaders, communities and ministries throughout PNMC.

Anchorage Service Adventure Unit

In August, the folks at **Prince of Peace Mennonite Church** welcomed a new <u>Service Adventure</u> group after having a year off. During that time the congregation was glad to provide housing for a Ukrainian refugee family. The Service Adventure Unit has a new leader and 3 participants who are already living life to the fullest in Anchorage! However, as the support committee was preparing the home for the coming year, a water heater leak was noticed. The church replaced it with a heater with a side arm to provide options for future use. The water heater cost \$4885.29 and was not in the Service Adventure budget, especially having taken a year off. As the snow comes down the mountains the unit van also needs new winter tires. The anticipated cost is \$1000. The Service Adventure Support Committee is asking for help with these expenses. They recognize that Service Adventure Anchorage has touched the lives of many people and this is an opportunity to give back. MENNONITE CHURCH USA



Mennonite Church USA is helping to fuel growth and diversity with its <u>Thrive Church Planting Grants</u>. This year, <u>Community of Hope Mennonite</u> <u>Church</u> in Bellingham, WA, was one of two recipients. The congregations are recognized for building circles of community in creative, Jesuscentered ways. "It's wonderful to witness how church planters and those in these worshipping communities are reimagining what it means to be a missional peace church," said Rachel Ringenberg Miller, MC USA's denominational minister for Ministerial Leadership.

"There are some advantages of meeting outdoors that I didn't anticipate," said Rachael Weasley, pastor and church planter of Community of Hope, describing the church's growing Wild Church ministry. "It makes us accessible to immunocompromised folks, and those who have religious trauma and aren't comfortable in a church building. We stand in a circle, kind of naturally. I think we are shaped by the architecture of the outdoors. It helps us remember that nature is outside of our control and so is God. There is something helpful about

that, especially when you're doing queer theology," she explained. Not everyone at Community of Hope identifies as queer, but they seek to do church in a Queer way, according to Weasley. She explains that this means looking at the gospel through the lens of queer theory, seeing how Jesus operates at the margins of power. The church, which started as an online community, has expanded through the help of the Thrive Grant to include in-person gatherings outdoors in the Wild Church tradition. Read the full story here.
