# From PNMC Executive Conference Minister, Eric Massanari

As I write, the oppressive—sometimes illegal—tactics being used by the United States federal government in their current immigration policies have reached my local community here in Whatcom County, WA. Last week, ICE agents stopped a car and, without presentation of a warrant for search or arrest, violently detained local immigration advocate, Alfredo "Lelo" Juarez Zeferino.

Local activists, including members of <u>Community of Hope Mennonite Church</u>, quickly gathered outside the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) temporary detention site near Ferndale in support of Lelo. Lelo was later transferred to the DHS detention center in Tacoma. It is believed that Lelo was targeted because of his activism on behalf of the local farm worker community. <u>Community to Community (C2C)</u>, a local food justice and immigrant rights organization here in Whatcom County, is posting <u>updates and opportunities to respond on their website</u>.

Faced with the trauma and violence being suffered by our immigrant friends and neighbors we are compelled to faithful action as disciples of Christ. Toward that end we want to offer a **90-minute teach-in on immigrant rights and advocacy for the PNMC community.** The session will be led by **Jay Stansell**, an attorney from Seattle, WA. Most recently, Jay's practice included serving 19 years as an Assistant Federal Public Defender, and before that he served as a Staff Attorney for Northwest Immigrant Rights Project. Jay's input will serve as helpful groundwork for more localized efforts in immigrant support and advocacy throughout the conference. **WHEN: Saturday, May 17, 10:30am-Noon Pacific Time (on Zoom)**

# Mennonite Church USA

The <u>Pam De Young Net Zero Energy Fund</u> provides funds to assist congregations interested in forms of renewable energy. The term, "net zero energy," describes buildings or communities that generate enough energy to meet their own needs.

- Congregations that craft and execute an ongoing plan that will move them toward net zero energy are eligible to apply.
- The grants are for hardware purchases related to solar panels, car charging stations or other renewable energy projects.
- Most solar grants are \$5,000, but congregations may request up to \$10,000. Car charging station grants are limited to \$1,800.
