# Bringing Neighbors (Vecinos) Together—One Meal at a Time

Vecinos is a grassroots initiative in the Witness and Services Commission at Zion Mennonite Church. Guided by a diverse steering group of community members, Vecinos is dedicated to building bridges between agricultural workers and their neighbors in the greater Woodburn area. Since launching last summer, Vecinos has hosted vibrant ethnic meal events in public parks and at Woodburn High School. More recently, the group gathered at Zion Mennonite Church, Chemeketa Community College, and at local farms or their farm worker housing. Every three weeks during the summer, a sit-down meal is shared at these locations—bringing warmth, connection, and celebration to the heart of our local agricultural community.

**Gratitude for Our Volunteers:** A heartfelt thank you to the 70+ regular volunteers from all walks of life who make these events possible. Your time, energy, and compassion are the backbone of Vecinos. Our volunteers range in age from 12 years old to 70+ years.

- Partner with like-minded organizations to amplify our impact


## **Short-Term Goals:**

#### **NEW RESOURCE FOR CONGREGATIONS:**

**Pastor Samuel Moran** and his spouse **Orfilia Moran** recently presented their latest publication, EL MINISTERIO DE TODOS LOS SANTOS (The Ministry of All the Saints). Based on biblical teachings about spiritual gifts given to all church members to empower the ministry of the congregation, the new publication includes the teacher manual, and individual spiral-bound study guides for each learner.

Pastor Samuel is a PNMC district pastor, and 30-year pastor of Ministerios Restauración, in Portland, OR. He originally presented the new study in a series of four workshops at Rio de Vida in McMinnville, OR, in early 2025. Later he presented the same material to a congregation in Oregon and a pastor group in Guatemala. Pastor Samuel's hope is that this newly released print resource will enrich congregational life for churches around the world.
